COMES NOW Drina Brunsting, as attorney-in-fact for Carl Henry Brunsting, individually, filing this Motion to Transfer Cause No. 2013-05455, styled *Carl Henry Brunsting, Independent Executor of the Estates of Elmer H. Brunsting and Nelva E. Brunsting v. Candace L. Kunz-Freed and Vacek & Freed, PLLC f/k/a The Vacek Law Firm, PLLC*, in the 164th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas, to Harris County Probate Court Number 4 and in support thereof would show as follows:

1. Cause No. 2013-05455, styled Carl Henry Brunsting, Independent Executor of the Estates of Elmer H. Brunsting and Nelva E. Brunsting v. Candace L. Kunz-Freed and Vacek & Freed, PLLC f/k/a The Vacek Law Firm, PLLC (the "District Court Case") was filed in district court on January 29, 2013. Carl Henry Brunsting filed the District Court Case in his capacity as executor of his parents' estates.

2. On February 19, 2015, Carl filed his Application to Resign as Independent Executor, and Carl's resignation as executor has been approved by this Court, creating a vacancy of party in the District Court Case. As of this filing, that vacancy has not been filled, but another hearing on the issue is scheduled for July 21, 2015 before this court.

3. The District Court Case is related to the probate proceedings and indeed to this cause of action. The issues in the District Court Case and this case are related and the damages sought in each action are potentially impacted by the other. Many of the same witnesses and some of the same evidence will also be used in both cases.

4. Notwithstanding the party vacancy, and perhaps because of it, the defendants in the District Court Case have filed a motion for summary judgment which is scheduled to be heard on July 31, 2015. Even if a successor personal representative is appointed on July 21, 2015, there would only be three days for that successor to evaluate the case and the motion before the response to the motion is due on July 24, 2015. Defendants have refused to postpone the hearing on their Motion for Summary Judgment until a successor has been appointed and had a reasonable opportunity to evaluate the case and respond appropriately to the motion.

5. Tex. Estates Code §34.001 provides that a judge of a statutory probate court may transfer a proceeding from a district court to the probate court if it involves a cause of action related to a probate proceeding pending in that probate court or in which the personal representative of an estate pending in the probate court is a party. The District Court Case meets that criteria.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Movant asks that the District Court Case be transferred to Harris County Probate Court 4, and for such other and further relief to which Movant may be entitled.
