* Methodists usually follow the official liturgy and will feel it is their way of suffering for their sins.

* Methodists believe in miracles and even expect miracles, especially during their stewardship visitation programs or when passing the plate.

 \ast Methodists think that the Bible forbids them from crossing the aisle while passing the peace.

* Methodists drink coffee as if it were the Third Sacrament.

* Methodists feel guilty for not staying to cleanup after their own wedding reception in the Fellowship Hall.

* Methodists are willing to pay up to one dollar for a meal at the church.

I did not read it because I do not care what Candy has to say to me on any subject especially this one. It has become increasingly clear to me that Carl's sisters are anything but supportive and that in fact are busying themselves on just how quickly they can judge me and tear down my family. They are only concerned with how much control they have over the situation and how I need to live my life. They are not at all interested in their brother's situation or welfare. They are all consumed with how everyone else should live their lives instead of looking at their own. I do not need people like that around me when I am trying to focus on getting my critically ill husband well. If you need to talk to anyone, perhaps it would be prudent to speak to some of your mean-spirited daughters on how to not trash or judge others.
