6	GUARDIANSHIP COORDINATOR: Yes.
7	Did you tell him about Brazoria County?
8	MS. KELLY: Well, I was speaking with
9	Marilyn, Your Honor. When we filed this application for
10	guardianship, Ms. Mintz was a resident of Clarewood. And
11	her daughter, Barbara, had taken her to Brazoria County
12	and then moved everything out of Clarewood. And she has a
13	power of attorney but so does my client, her brother.
14	They have dual power of attorney. And so she's been very
15	uncooperative. My client hasn't seen his mother in almost
16	three months.
17	We had a service issue because I brought it
18	in Harris County. Harris County Sheriffs can't go to
19	Brazoria County. She wouldn't bring her here. But I
20	did the ad litem did accept service from a constable
21	this morning on behalf of her client, and I've also had
22	her personally served.
23	THE COURT: You really can't do that, you
24	know.
25	MS. KELLY: So I don't know what to do, but

6 1 she's holding her hostage in Brazoria County. 2 MS. PITRE: I thought she was going to be 3 here. 4 GUARDIANSHIP COORDINATOR: The ward has been 5 served with an IME already but in Harris County. 6 MS. KELLY: Yes. And Barbara, the daughter 7 who has control of her, has filed her own application. So 8 she's before this Court. And she had told the ad litem 9 yesterday that she would bring her mother here today. 10 That's why I had the constable. But then she said her 11 mother fell and they were in the hospital all night and 12 got back late. I don't know how accurate that is. It may 13 very well be accurate. But I can tell you for three 14 months my client has been trying to see his mother; and 15 this woman, Barbara, is doing everything in her power to 16 stop this process.

THE COURT: Well, I would suggest you file a motion to get her to appear and show cause --

19 MS. KELLY: Yeah.

THE COURT: -- why she shouldn't have to do

21 that.

MS. KELLY: Okay.

THE COURT: But I'll sign the IME because

15	he'll do it before then. And then we need to do something
16	about that. All right. Thank y'all.
